Online Payment System

We are currently investigating introducing an online payment system. We could be a **cashless** school. Using this system you will be able to pay for breakfast club, school lunches, clubs, school trips, camps, and other school activities from the comfort of your own home.

You can top-up your ParentPay account online by debit or credit card, or in cash through PayPoint stores. Your ParentPay balance can be used immediately to pay for most of your children's items at school.

It's simple, safe, and convenient and your child will no longer need to carry cash into school. This is the same system that is used in several primary schools in the area including Bodmin and Wadebridge colleges.
